Togo: "We support every resolution concerning Sudan and Somalia and we want to become a permanent member of the UN Security Council."



Russian Federation: "We, the Russian Federation, support the eastern African region to become more stable and improve their infrastructure without receiving financial aid."



Colombia: "We share the opinion to provide non-armed help in order to stabilize their institutions and economic situation. Furthermore we would like to help establishing democracy."



United States of America: "Our main interest is a democratization of the countries. We are ready to support the countries financially to reach this goal."



Human Rights Watch: "We challenge the honorable delegates and the distinguished chair to maintain human rights and to support the cause of human rights for all. It is necessary for the international community to give attention to the rights and wrongs of the world, to the political, social, and environmental issues."



United Kingdom: "Our belief is that everyone has got the right to live a life in peace and dignity and it is the responsibility of the Security Council to protect this right."



Morocco: "Morocco's main interest in both countries is on the one hand, to stabilize and form the governments of both countries and on the other hand to solve social conflicts and protect the Sudanese and Somali societies."



Guatemala: "We want to support the government of Sudan and Somalia with financial support of the USA. Our military forces could protect the actions of social actors and ngo's but we need financial support."



Portugal: "In our opinion the member states of the Security Council, who are financially able to do so, have to send military forces to Somalia and Sudan to monitor the situation in these states. We request the other states to help building infrastructure and develop the economy. Portugal is not able to support these missions financially."




French Republic: "The French Republic looks forward to assure the conditions for a peaceful and humane life for all people as well as a long lasting solution to solve longlasting problems for example: Piracy or Terrorism."



India: "Cooperation is our central argument! We delegates have to cooperate with each other to find a good solution for the problems in Sudan and Somalia. We want to help and control the countries without using violence."



Germany: "Our special interest focuses on the adherence of human rights and the structure of the states."



Pakistan: "For Sudan we are interested in political stability and adherence of human rights. Regarding Somalia we wish to become more active in fighting against piracy and helping the civil society."



Azerbaijan: "To gain Peace and security the countries have to be stabilized without them losing their sovereignty."



South Africa: "South Africa wishes to bring peace and stability to its fellow African nations with support of other African countries."
